

The Northern Lights **AURORA VIEWING**



The aurora borealis (commonly called northern lights) is best viewed under the following conditions:

- When the sky is clear (not cloudy); check to see if you can see stars.
- When solar activity is high; this means there is a greater chance for the lights to appear. The aurora prediction [from the University of Alaska](#).
- When you are nestled away (at our location!) from the interfering city lights (light pollution).
- Plan on staying awake to go outside and check the skies between 10 pm and 2 am.

While many people travel to remote sites to view the aurora, many locals are able to view the lights from the following locations much closer to town.

West Side

- A. Chena Ridge (two miles from our property)
- B. Ester Dome (10 miles from our property)
- C. Murphy Dome (22 miles from our property)

North Side

- D. Pedro Dome (30 miles from our property)
- E. Cleary Summit (30 miles out of town)
